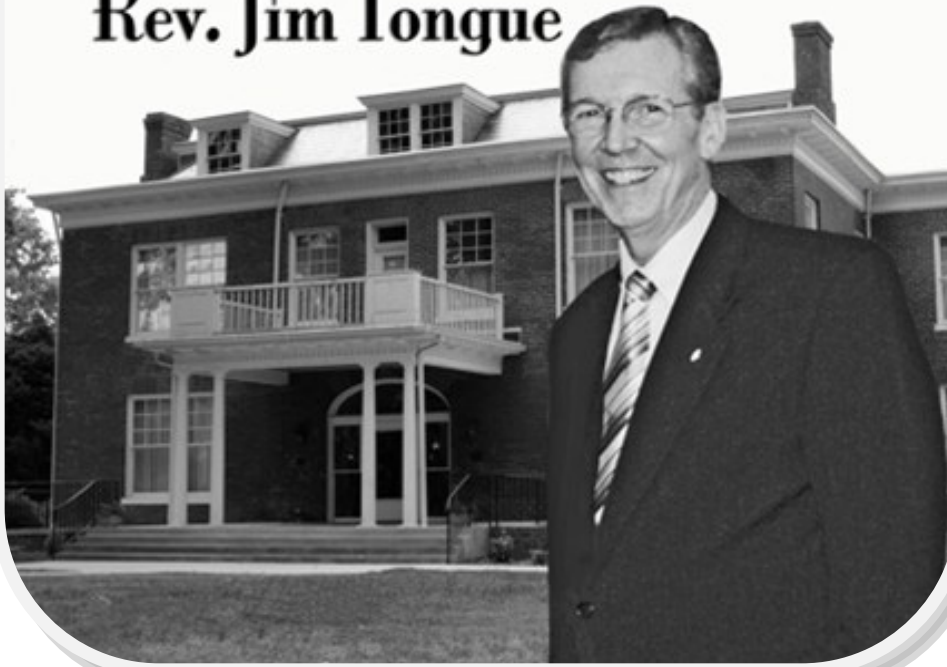

Farmville District Lay Speaker/Servant School in March



The Farmville District will offer Lay Speaker/Servant School at Keysville UMC over three Sundays, from 2:30 to 6:00 pm on each of the dates of the 13th, 20th and 27th. Three courses will be offered. Cost for each class covers the book which will be individually mailed to each registered person.

- **Basic Course:** Teacher: Maxine Crenshaw, Pastor at Union UMC. The cost for the Basic course will be \$24.
- **Two advanced classes:**
Lay Speakers are Accountable Disciples”, commonly referred to as “Accountable Discipleship”: Teacher: Bonnie Pizeck, Pastor at Hurt UMC. Cost for the class will be \$28.
Effective Preaching: From Your Heart to Theirs”: Teacher: Don Pizeck, Pastor at Mt. Laurel UMC. Cost for this class will be \$19. Registration will be required before or on March 1. This will allow time for books to be mailed and any assignments prior to first class to be completed.

2011 College Scholarships and Awards

MERIT AWARD SCHOLARSHIP— Students who are eligible for this scholarship must be seniors planning to attend a United Methodist college or university in the fall of 2011. The deadline is March 1, 2011. These awards are made possible by the General Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministry and range from \$500 - \$1,000 per award.

Each nominee must be nominated by their local church youth council, the Administrative Board, Council on Ministries or Administrative Council, or they may be nominated by their District Youth Council or District Council on Ministries.

There are three areas of participation. (1) Local Church and Community; (2) Local Church and District; (3) Local Church and Conference. **NOTE** - There are cases where a nominee has not participated in all three of these areas. On your application, use the ones you have been active in. No matter how many areas your application will be given consideration.

THE HARRY DENMAN EVANGELISM AWARD for Clergy, Lay, and Youth—Applications are being accepted and the deadline is May 15. This award recognizes a person whose life and ministry exemplifies the teaching of Christ and the Great Commission. ## CHILDREN'S MINISTRY NEWS

This year's Farmville District Children's Retreat was a great success. Our theme this year was "Epic Truth" based on John 14:6 "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father, but through me." We had 90 children and 30 adults plus 6 DCYM in attendance for the weekend. We collected 678 canned goods for local needy families. Yea!! The 6<sup>th</sup> grade girls and boys delivered 26 bags of food to Peele Manor (located directly behind VUMAC). We also collected 225 winter items for the homeless shelter in Lynchburg. Way to go!! Those items include 90 winter hats, 18 scarves, 109 pairs of winter gloves, and 9 pairs of socks. We also made cards of love to send with those winter items so that we could warm their hearts as we warm their bodies.

From the 8am registrations on Saturday to the good-byes at 1pm on Sunday, we had a blast. I would also like to say that from beginning to end I could feel God's presence among us. The kids like to joke and say that VUMAC has "haunted rooms" but every year I tell the kids that the only spirit with us at VUMAC is the Holy Spirit and I mean it. It amazes me that no matter what function I am attending at VUMAC I can feel His presence. "Even at a children's retreat?" you may ask. "Especially at our Children's Retreat." I will emphatically tell you. To hear the kids praising God during music with Ruth Ann. To hear their questions AND answers in Bible 101 & 102 with Carol. To see them express themselves creatively in arts & crafts with Michelle. To see them having fun together in recreation and swimming. To see them so passionate about missions with Martha. To see the kids proudly wearing their t-shirts throughout the community after the retreat. To see the kids performing their God given talents at our Saturday night talent show. To see the DCYM and Marsha Davis passionately giving themselves to God's service for the Sunday morning worship service. I will answer again emphatically "Yes".

We made a few changes this year, which I think proved to be very positive for the weekend. One change was with the talent show. All participants had to pre-register and all entries had to be church appropriate. We all had a great time watching the kids perform and I heard many say this year was one of our best talent shows yet. Another change we made this year was to allow time for church families to get together with their kids just before bedtime. This was time to reflect on the day, have a devotional, quite any fears, and/or just have a little bonding time. This was another awesome way to let God work in the weekend. I know of one 6<sup>th</sup> grade boy in particular who had some major "God questions". After speaking to his chaperones for a while, the adults approached me and said he might need to speak to a pastor. A pastor who was attending the retreat with his church kids took the time to talk with this boy the next morning. When I spoke to the child later that Sunday evening he told me his favorite part of the weekend was the conversations he was able to have with his chaperones and that pastor. He also went on to tell me that his male chaperone found the exact answer to his questions in his daily devotional for that day. That boy couldn't believe it. The answers to major life questions were in the Bible! A huge thank you to those who helped that boy grow closer to God. One last change we made was having 2 adults monitor each hall after bedtime to make sure the kids were quiet in their rooms (hopefully sleeping). It did seem the adults were better rested on Sunday morning. A huge thank you to our "Vigil-Aunties" and "Vigil-Uncles".

I know I say this every year, but I must say it again. "I had an awesome time!!" I do know that we could never make it work without all the hard work of the activity leaders, adult chaperones, the DCYM, Marilyn and George Davis, and Marsha Davis. Thank you for all of your time, talents, love, and dedication to God, our children and this retreat.

### **HEALTH KITS**

- 1 hand towel (15"x25" up to 17"x27", no kitchen towels)
- 1 washcloth
- 1 bath-sized bar of soap (3 oz. and up)
- 6 adhesive sterile bandages (Band-Aids)
- 1 comb (large and sturdy, not pocket-sized)
- 1 metal nail file or fingernail clippers (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
- 1 toothbrush (single brushes only in original wrapper, no child-size brushes)

Seal all items in a 1GL plastic bag. \$12 donation will allow UMCOR to purchase a health kit.

Do not include personal notes, money or additional materials in the kits. Kits should be packed in boxes with only one type of kit in each box, with contents clearly written on the outside along with your church name.

### **SCHOOL KITS**

- 1 pair blunt scissors (rounded tip), 1 hand-held pencil sharpener
  - 1 30-centimeter ruler, 6 unsharpened pencils with erasers
  - 1 large eraser, 2 1/2", 1 box of 24 crayons (only 24)
  - 3 pads (or loose leaf)- 8 1/2"x11" ruled paper (250 sheets total)
- Prepare a 14"x16" (finished size) cloth bag with handles and one of these three closures (Velcro, snap or button) and place items in the bag. \$11 donation will allow UMCOR to purchase a school kit.

### **BABY/LAYETTE KITS**

- 6 cloth diapers; 2 shirts or 2 one-piece body suits
  - 2 baby washcloths, 2 gowns or sleepers
